TOXOCARA CANIS, TOXOCARA CATI, TOXOCARA LEONINA

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Toxocariasis (Larva Migrans Visceralis) is a zoonosis extremely common on globe. It is determined by the migration of Toxocara Canis and Toxocara Cati larvae form in liver, lungs, myocardium and rarely in eye and brain. Usually the symptoms are: general malaise, fever, eosinophilia and leukocytosis. The positive and differential diagnosis is hard to establish by clinicians and raise many problems which could delay the antiparasitic treatment, evolution, in this case, could be undetermined. The surveillance and control of this geohelmintiasis needs measures against reservoirs, modes of transmition and measures of protection for the susceptible population.
